The early week runs were light, however, the late week run included 575 head of nice hard-fed stock. Not only were records shattered in Lancaster County with prices up to 93.00, but several producers should have gotten a lock box to carry their checks home after the active Thursday New Holland Market, as farmer/feeders were averaging from 88.00-90.00 on their loads. The western direct feedyards got the ball rolling on late Wednesday morning by moving their fats 3.00-4.00 higher in Kansas and Texas at 85.00, and from 86.00-87.00 in Nebraska. Dressed sales were 3.00-5.00 higher from 135.00-137.00. Meat markets had no choice but to increase as the price of finished cattle continues to rise. Choice cuts were at mostly 148.00 on Thursday, with the Select cutout value from 131.00-132.00. Live cattle contracts at the Chicago Mercantile Exchange were also higher as they try to keep on an even keel with the western live cattle market. Spot September closed at 86.30 on Thursday, with October at 84.90, and December at 82.77. The Holstein steer supply was mixed this week, with prices trending mostly 1.00-2.00 higher. Lean slaughter cows sold steady to 1.00 lower on Tuesday, with all losses regained on Thursday as bids were steady to 1.00 higher. Flesher cows sold 2.00-3.00 lower on Tuesday, with prices a full 3.00-5.00 higher late in the week. The Thursday supply included a nice run of Breaking and Premium White cows which drew good buyer activity. Slaughter bulls sold steady to firm. The reported supply this week in Lancaster County included 852 head of slaughter steers, 126 head of slaughter heifers, 942 head of slaughter cows, 69 head of slaughter bulls, and 126 head of feeder cattle. **Ag Officials Endorse Expo**

LAFAYETTE TWP., N.J. — On Thursday, leaders of the state agriculture departments from New Jersey, New York, and Pennsylvania endorsed the third annual Northeast Small Farm and Rural Living Expo as a way to help preserve farming in the Tri-State area.

The Small Farm Expo, a project involving agricultural, cultural, and tourism entities from New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and New York, is moving to Warren County, N.J., this year after its first two outings in Pennsylvania's Pocono region. The two-day event will be Sept. 20-21 at the Warren County Farmers' Fairgrounds in Harmony Township, N.J.

New Jersey Agriculture Secretary Charles M. Kuperus, Pennsylvania Agriculture Secretary Dennis C. Wolff, and Deputy Commissioner Rick Zimmerman of the New York Department of Agriculture and Markets, who represented Commissioner Nathan Rudgers, met at Ken and Julie Bechtold's Stoney Croft Farm with Small Farm Expo organizers to offer their support for the event.

"Most of New Jersey's farms are family-owned operations," said Kuperus. "While our average farm size — at 86 acres — is much smaller than the national average, our proximity to major markets offers unique opportunities for

our farmers to be successful. The Small Farm Expo is designed to provide farmers with the information they need to establish and expand their small farm operations, and keep agriculture strong here in the Garden State."

"I am pleased to be here to support the third annual Northeast Small Farm and Rural Living Expo today," said Wolff. "As the foundation of society, agriculture is a very important industry in the United States. This Expo is a great partnership between agriculture, government, and business and is a great benefit for the industry."

"Small farms are a valuable component of New York's agricultural industry," Rudgers said in a statement. "Through the efforts of dedicated farm families, small scale agriculture will continue to be an important part of New York State's rural economy."

The site of the news conference, Stoney Croft Farm, has been operating since 1986. Owners Ken and Julie Bechtold keep 15 to 20 Jersey cows that supply milk for the farm's cheese-making operation. They own 21 of the 140 acres that they farm.

The Bechtolds, who will be presenting a seminar on cheese-making at the Small Farm Expo, produce varieties of Cheddar and Colby cheeses on their farm.

HURLOCK, Md. — Thursday, Sept. 11, the Maryland Grazing Lands Conservation Initiative will conduct a tour of the largest Maryland planting of eastern gamagrass at the Bill Edwards Bison Farm in Hurlock, Maryland.

Edwards depends on this little known native plant to supply high quality forage in large quantities during the hottest part of the summer.

Eastern gamagrass is a relative of corn, but has several advantages in Maryland's variable weather. It is a very deep-rooted grass that will seek out moisture deep in the soil.

The tour and talk will begin at 9:30 a.m. to 12 p.m. at the William Edwards Bison Farm at 7010 Hynson Road, Hurlock, Md.
