Most farms The following are the August-to-August changes for selected states: Texas 5 .3%, New York -1.4%, Vermont -3.6%, Pennsylvania -4.6%, Florida -9.0%, Kentucky -9.6% and Virginia -10.1%. The base price for Class I milk for October 2003 is \$14,27 per cwt., up \$.56 from September. A Class I differential specific to each pricing point (county) is added to the base price to determine the applicable Class I price. The Class II skim milk price for October is \$6.66, down \$0.03 from September.

The aftermath of Hurricane Isabel is still being felt in the Middle Atlantic area. Residents and businesses in the Carolinas, Virginia, Maryland and Pennsylvania are still without electricity. While power was lost, affected plants had to redirect their milk to other outlets and now that power is being restored or generators are available, these plants want milk back and some are rather impatient about getting it back.
