Compared to last Monday, barrows and gilts sold 1.00 higher, to nearly 2.00 higher at times. With the soaring price of red meat becoming very apparent to consumers, pork has become an option in the meat case; which in turn has brought up hog prices over the past two weeks. The supply included 406 head of barrows and gilts, 224 sows, 12 boars, with 249 head of roasters (not included in total).

Compared to last week, U.S. 1-2, 20-40 pound slaughter pigs sold sharply lower on very light demand. All other weights within the U.S. 1-2, and U.S. 2 supply sold steady to weak. Bidding activity was relatively good, although buyer attendance was light. All pigs continue to go to slaughter as mandated.

Pigs consigned to the Wednesday sale are graded on arrival, and sold on their in-weights. Prices are quoted per hundred weight.
