

KILE Announces 2003 Show

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — The Keystone International Livestock Exposition (KILE) is in its 47th year at Harrisburg. The Exposition is recognized nationally as a showcase for the nation's top beef cattle, swine, sheep, and horses. It will be at the Farm Show Complex in Harrisburg, Sept. 30-Oct. 6.

This year has been designated as "Year of the Beef," so beef cattle exhibitors will receive special attention as part of the effort to increase public awareness of the cattle industry. Ten breeds

will be shown. They are Angus, Limousin, Hereford, Shorthorn, Simmental, Red Angus, American British White Park, Texas Longhorn, Highland, and Maine-Anjou.

Nine breeds of horses will be shown. They are Haflinger, Appaloosa, Belgian, Clydesdale, Shire, Percheron, Paso Fino, Quarter Horse, and Arabian. Classes include halter, driving, hitching, and riding. The Draft Horse Show is a qualifying show in the North American Six Horse Hitch Classic Series, with approximately twenty-six of the top

rated Six Horse Hitches trying to qualify for next year's National Competition. The "All Breeds Classic Series Six Horse

Hitch Show" will be conducted as the Friday evening arena performance at the Exposition.

In the beef area, KILE has been designated as a Simmental "Progress Through Performance" Show as well as the Eastern National Hereford Classic Show. The Limousin Cattle Show has also again been designated a "Medal of Excellence" Show.

Swine will be represented by eight different purebred breeds being shown, plus the open and Junior Barrow Shows. The National Junior Swine Association Eastern Regional Show and Skilathon will be back again this year.

Starting on Thursday, at noon, will be the Stockmen's Trade Show. Everything from T-shirts and jewelry to saddles and horse

trailers will be available to purchase from the vendor booths at the show.

A hundred collegiate, FFA, and 4-H students from several states always enter the junior livestock judging and stockman contests at KILE. These keen educational competitions are excellent tests of knowledge and skill, providing students with valuable experience for their futures in agriculture.

More than 4,800 entries are expected for the 2003 show, which offers a record \$200,000 in premiums.

A tantalizing assortment of foods prepared by various Pennsylvania commodity groups will be available and the Kessler's Barnyard Baby Exhibit where young and old alike may touch and pet the animals is always a favorite spot at the show.

• Tuesday, Sept. 30 — The show officially opens with a Haflinger Show at 8 a.m.

• Wednesday, Oct. 1 — Show opens at 7 a.m. with the Shire, Percheron, plus a draft horse hitch show in the evening.

• Thursday, Oct. 2 — The Belgian and Clydesdale Show will begin at 7 a.m. Draft Horse Hitch Shows will be featured at 6:30 p.m. The Opening Ceremony will be at 4 p.m. with the Livestock Person of the Year and Outstanding FFA and 4-H Livestock members being recognized. Breeding sheep and swine judging will begin at 5 p.m.

• Friday, Oct. 3 — Stockman's Day — The Draft Horse Youth Show will take place in the large arena starting at 9 a.m. Also, at 9 a.m. begins the judging of breeding swine, sheep, and cattle. Hereford and Simmental Breeding Cattle Sales will be in the Sale Arena at 1 p.m. and 3 p.m., respectively. At 6 p.m., the Keystone Classic Swine Sale will take place, which will feature eight breeds of swine. The Heavy Hitch Show begins at 6 p.m. The breeds featured are Belgian, Clydesdale,

Shire, and Percheron with their 6-Horse Competition. Also included will be Draft Horse Hitch Classes. There will be a \$5 charge for the evening performance.

• Saturday, Oct. 4 — Kid's Day at the Exposition. The Inter-collegiate and Junior Livestock Judging Contest is at 8 a.m. Judging also begins at 8 a.m. for the Sheep Show. A special attraction at noon is the Keystone Lead Line, an attractive combination, as sheep and shepherd are dressed in their finest. Also at noon, Lebanon Valley Farmers/Fulton Bank is sponsoring Agri-Kid Olympics. Farm-related competitive events will be for children at 3 p.m. with the Kids Pedal Power Pull. At 8 a.m. the Paso Fino Horse Show is featured. The yearling Bred Ewe Sale begins at 3 p.m. Shorthorn, Limousin, and Angus Breeding Cattle sales will be in the Sale Arena at 10 a.m., noon, and 2 p.m., respectively. On Saturday evening, at 6 p.m., the Club Calf Sale will be conducted.

Saturday evening will feature the Appaloosa and Quarter Horse jumping and group classes.

• Sunday, Oct. 5 — At 8 a.m. a family sunrise church service will be conducted. Junior beef breeding cattle and sheep judging begins at 8 a.m. Also at 8 a.m. is the barrow on-foot show and the Appaloosa, and Quarter Horse shows. At noon is the Junior Steer Show. A busy day at the Expo continues with lambs, sheep, and hog judging throughout the rest of the day.

• Monday, Oct. 6 — As KILE enters its last day, there is still a busy schedule. The Arabian Horse Show will begin at 8 a.m. and the cattle and sheep judging continues in the respective show rings. The Keystone Stockman's Contest Awards Program is scheduled for 3:15 p.m.
