important were Francois Seignouret and Prudent Mallard. Seignouret was known for his massive, richly carved Rococo.

Many of the German immigrants who came to New York after the European revolutions of 1848, were skilled cabinetmakers, specializing in ornate carving.

John Henry Belter, who had come from Germany in 1844 not only created the Rococo Revival-style furniture, but received a series of patents utilizing his laminating process. It relieved the often heavy look of the furniture. The wood was first pressed in steam molds to create its curves. Then the ornamental carved work was glued on after the pierced backing was made. However, these techniques were not originated by Belter. Belter's elaborately carved, laminated rosewood furniture was not only copied by his

competitors but shipped from his New York factory to the wealthy and famous around the country. Mary Todd Lincoln, who moved to Chicago after the President's assassination (1865), ordered a rosewood parlor suite, with frames made by Belter.

CLUES: Since these flamboyant rococo pieces were shipped

around the country, they can still turn up anywhere. However, because so many craftsmen copied the style, get written authentication before spending too much. The words "attributed to" aren't good enough. Small pieces can still be affordable examples...if you like the look.
