Vendors will be set up and will offer their varied wares - ceramics, paintings, jewelry, woodcrafts, baskets, tack, embroidery, candles, jams - all will be on display and available for sale.

The carriage museum, an old kitchen, chicken coop, harness and tool sheds will be open to visitors. Live music will add to the festivities throughout the day. To wrap up the day, a parade at 2:30 p.m. will showcase the horses and antique machinery.

The Delmarva Driving Club was founded in 1983 to keep the skills of driving horses alive, and strives to be a link between transportation and farming methods used a hundred years ago and today's sport of driving horses. ## USDA Expands Pilot Internet Payment System

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Agriculture Secretary Ann M. Veneman last week announced that USDA is expanding its pilot e-LDP program to 50 counties, with every state having one participating county. The service, which allows producers to request and receive loan deficiency payments (LDPs) online, has been available as a pilot program in 21 counties since May 2002.

'This program saves America's farmers and ranchers time, example of how USDA is harnessing the power of the Internet to better serve producers," said Veneman. "The pilot program is part of the Administration's e-Government initiative, the government-wide effort to use technology to better serve individuals and businesses across the coun-




