## Dairylea Annual Meeting Oct. 14-15

SYRACUSE, N.Y. — The 96th Annual Meeting of Dairylea Cooperative will be conducted on Tuesday, Oct. 14, and Wednesday, Oct. 15, at the Holiday Inn in Liverpool, N.Y. The meeting will include reports from senior management, presentations from top executives in the dairy industry, and educational sessions.

At the annual meeting, Dairylea's members will hear from President and Chairman Clyde Rutherford and Chief Executive Officer Rick Smith, who will provide an overview of the Cooperative's ac-

complishments and financial performance over the past year, as well as reflect on events in the dairy industry. Members will be recognized for progressive farming and the production of top quality milk; scholarships will be awarded to Dairylea youth; and fifty-year members will be recognized.

Top executives in the dairy industry will speak during the two-day event. The first speaker for the general session on Tuesday will be John Kaneb, president and chief executive officer of HP Hood.

Following Kaneb will be Kurt Epprecht, vice president of procurement for Great Lakes Cheese. Closing the program will be Gary Hanman, president and chief executive officer of Dairy Farmers of America. All speakers will participate in a question and answer session at the end of the day.

Day two of the event features Jerry Kozak, president and chief executive officer of the National Milk Producers Federation. The day's program will also include a panel discussion on management of farm cash and profits. The panel will include John Wilson, vice president of marketing/economic analysis for Dairy Farmers of America, Inc.; Ed Gallagher, Dairylea's vice president of planning and regulatory policy; and two farmer-members of Dairylea. Closing the program will be the Cooperative's annual business meeting and passage of resolutions.
