

Jersey Supreme At York Fair

YORK (York Co.) — A Jersey junior three-year-old, exhibited by 4-H member Amanda Thompson, Wellsville, took supreme champion honors at York Fair's dairy show.

Julie-K Declo Delight was the winner of the M. Ebert Rutter revolving trophy awarded annually to the best of the field of dairy breed champions. The fair's supreme title added to a growing list of awards won by Delight, including breed champion of both the 2002 and 2003 county 4-H dairy roundups and last year's York Fair Jersey breed reserve championship. Delight is scored VG, with a three year projected milk record of 19,000. As a heifer, she finished her first lactation with 16,304 milk, 703 fat, and 534 protein.

Competing for the honor were York Fair dairy breed champions, including the Ayrshire winner, exhibited by Susan Richardson, Fawn Grove, Guernsey champion, Rutter Bros. Magicmans Rebel, junior three-year-old owned by youth exhibitor Kelly Johnson, York; Brown Swiss, Kratt Emory Spearmint, exhibited by David Krone, Glen Rock; Holstein, Walk-Le Encore Nicci, exhibited by Leroy, Brenda and Brad Walker, Thomasville; and Milking Shorthorn, Joy-El Othello Liza, exhibited by the Crowl family's Joy-El Farm, Airville.
