Retail and food service demand ranged light to moderate at best with the West being affected by ongoing strike problems. Supplies of all sizes were more than sufficient to satisfy current trade needs. In the parts structure, breast items were at least adequate to readily available and at times discounted to help clear. Dark meat items were adequate to available, and wings were close to tight and moving at premium levels. In production areas, live supplies were moderate at weights in a full range, but mostly desirable.
