Hen necks traded at 20.50 cents delivered export for prompt shipments and at 22.50 cents delivered export for November shipments.

Trade sentiment was cautious and unsettled on yolks, steady to fully steady on balance. Demand was light to active with offerings in close balance to available. Overall, floor stocks of whole and whites were reported as tight, and yolks somewhat more available. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending 04 October 2003 were 1% less than the previous week, and unchanged when compared to a year ago.

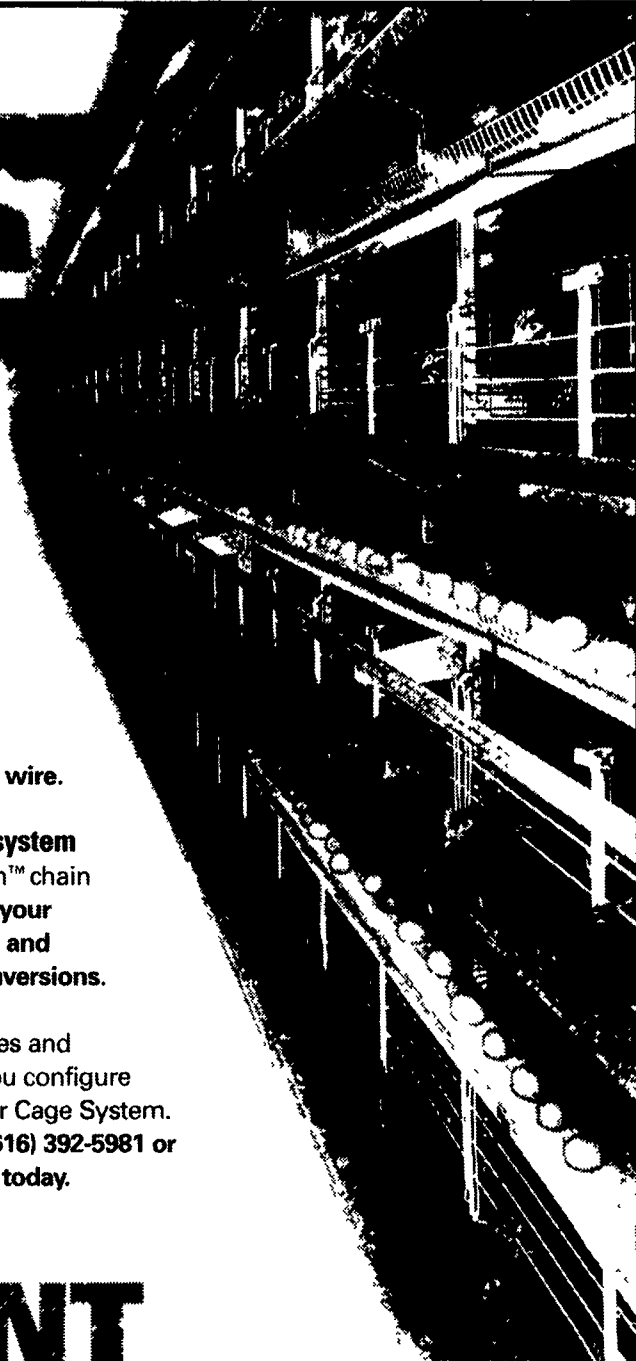
