addressed the audience about what is happening at the agriculture department.

Wolff spoke about his "Harvest Tour," which began last Thursday.

"No matter what part of Pennsylvania you go to, it becomes very obvious how important agriculture is to the state economy," said Wolff.

Wolff also touched upon several new initiatives the agriculture department is working on.

To help increase awareness to Pennsylvania agriculture products, Wolff announced the plans for "Pennsylvania Preferred," to be unveiled at the time of the 2004 Farm Show.

"It is a way that will be branding our products that are produced here in Pennsylvania," said Wolff. "So when these products go to the marketplace, consumers will have the option to buy locally and support local agriculture."

Wolff continued to say that this program will include the entire cross section of the food supply, landscape and nursery industry, and hardwood industry.

"Any agricultural products

that are grown, produced, and processed in Pennsylvania will have the opportunity to be in this program,' said Wolff.

Wolff also reviewed several education, dairy industry, agribusiness, and environmental initiatives the agriculture department has been developing.

"The Department of Agriculture is taking a little different role than it has in previous years," said Wolff in regards to his departmental initiatives.

Wolff also stated Gov. Ed Rendell administration's commitment to agriculture and awareness of agriculture's importance to economic development.

"When you think of every dollar of farm revenue turning into \$10 of gross revenue in the state," said Wolff, "that's phenomenal."

Wolff's comments follow up Rendell's address last Friday where the governor spoke about several administration priorities such as property taxes and the opening of the Small Business First Loans and Machinery and Equipment Loan Funds to agriculture. Additionally, the governor said he opened the First Industry Fund to both agriculture and tourism.

Lois Steele, state community

service director, praised the audience for the excellent response for the statewide service project. This year's project was a clothing drive for The Career Wardrobe, an organization that assists economically disadvantaged women trying to transition from welfare programs to work.

Grange members donated more than 1,000 items in job-interview-appropriate women's clothing.

Steele also recognized several Granges for their outstanding work in community service for 2003. Winning in the Pomona Grange category was Montour/ Northumberland/Union Pomona Grange; in the local grange category under 75 members, Elkland Grange; and in the over 75 category, Perry Valley Grange.

Carl Meiss, state public relations and membership director, commended the local Granges for an excellent year in new memberships and thanked them for their hard work as he presented the membership awards.

Meiss also said that October brought a record high in monthly new membership in a recent history and gave special recognition to Middletown Grange in Berks County for 47 new members in October.
