Demand was light to good with yolk offerings adequate but held with some confidence, whites and whole were tight and less available Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending October 18, 2003 were 2% less than the previous week, and 4% lower than a year ago.
