Wolff Kicks Off Harvest Tour

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — Agriculture Secretary Dennis C. Wolff arrived at Hanover Shoe Farms before sunrise last week to begin a two-week Harvest Tour to promote Pennsylvania agriculture.

"Agriculture is a very diverse in-dustry in Pennsylvania," said Wolff. "It is important to get out and meet the people who work hard every day to keep this industry thriving, to learn from them and to hear their concerns.'

At Hanover Shoe Farms in York County, one of the premier standardbred horse breeding farms in the world, Wolff was taken on a tour of the facility. There, he saw Western Hanover, one of the most highly sought after sires.
