**A Good Day for Music**


Two men born on November 6 made a great impact on the world of music. **Adolphe Sax** was a Belgian musician and inventor born in 1814, and **John Philip Sousa**, American composer and band director, was born in 1854. Sax invented the saxophone and a family of brass wind instruments for band and orchestra, the saxhorns. Sousa, known as "The March King," employed some of those instruments to create his stirring marches. After leading the United States Marine Band for 12 years, Sousa formed his own band in 1892. The best known of his many pieces is "Stars and Stripes Forever."



**Chocolate Bread Pudding**

**P**reheat oven to 350°F. Combine first three ingredients and 1 1/3 cups milk in a double boiler, cook until smooth. Add butter, remove from heat. Beat eggs, stir in salt, vanilla, and 2/3 cup milk. Add to chocolate mixture. Cook over hot water until thick. Pour mixture into a greased 1 1/2-quart baking dish. Bake in oven for 20 minutes.

**1 cup soft bread-crumbs**  
**2 ounces baking chocolate**  
**1 1/4 cups sugar**  
**2 cups milk**  
**2 tbsp. butter**  
**2 eggs**  
**1/4 tsp. salt**  
**1/2 tsp. vanilla**
