There were a few direct cattle traded in Nebraska on Thursday, from mostly 98,00-99,00, which is 1.00-2.00 lower However, marketing in the midwestern states does remain light, as the amount of true finished cattle is low. Slaughter Holstein steers and slaughter heifer receipts were light this week in the County. Not only were they light, but the few that were available were lower quality.
