scoffed at by President Thomas Jefferson. It was Sarah Hale, magazine editor, whose efforts eventually led to what we recognize as Thanksgiving. Ms. Hale wrote many editorials championing her cause in the "Boston Ladies' Magazine," and later in "Godey's Lady's Book."

Finally after all of Hale's obsessing, Thanksgiving became a reality when in 1863, President Lincoln proclaimed the last Thursday in November as a national day of Thanksgiving. It was proclaimed by every president after that and in 1941, Thanksgiving was finally sanctioned by Congress as a legal holiday, as the fourth Thursday in November.

Today, the usual fare consists of turkey, dressing, mashed potatoes, vegetables, hot bread, and pumpkin pie. As the Centre County Dairy Princess I am al-

ways on the lookout for new and exciting recipes to use for this traditional day. Please enjoy this different variety of pumpkin pie.

CREAM CHEESE PUMPKIN PIE

8 ounces cream cheese, softened
 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
 1/4 cup sugar
 1 egg
 Mix and spread in 9-inch unbaked pie shell.
 Combine:
 1 1/4 cups cooked pumpkin
 1 teaspoon cinnamon
 1/2 cup sugar
 1/4 teaspoon each ginger and nutmeg
 Blend in:
 1 slightly beaten egg
 1 cup evaporated milk
 Carefully pour fully mixed pumpkin mixture over cheese mixture. Bake at 350 degrees for 65-70 minutes. For an added treat always top with delicious whipped cream.
