Winter Wheat ratings were up 2 percent from last week at 50 percent Corn found support from soybeans, along with good demand. Wheat was 8-15 cents higher except Portland steady to 4 cents higher. Corn was 3-7 cents higher. Sorghum was mux, from 3 cents lower to 9 cents higher. Soybeans were 8-11 cents higher.
