Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds varied and was about moderate overall. Seller of ferings were adequate and were in the closer better balance on the larger sizes. Live supplies were moderate, weights were mostly desirable. Processor schedules were moderate. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 62 to 71 cents. Trade sentiment was steady. In the parts complex, buyer interest continued to center on a tight supply of whole breasts. Boneless/skinless breasts and tenders were fully adequate. Thighs were clearing well. Other cuts were generally noted as adequate and in a manageable balance.

Light type fowl were adequate for the fair to moderate demand.

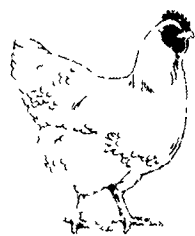
