Bills were paid for boarding and medical attendance for paupers who were sick in different parts of the county, one of whom has since been brought to the Poor House. 418 way-faring persons were provided with board, lodging, &c., of whom 23 were Americans, 31 Germans, 23 Irishmen, 11 Englishmen, 3 Frenchmen, 2 Italians, 3 Scotchmen and 1 Welshman.
