Whereas, in and by an Act of General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled "An Act to regulate the General Elections within this Commonwealth," it is enjoin'd upon me to give public notice of said Elections and to enunciate in said notice what officers are to be elected, I, J. J. CESSNA, Sheriff of the County of Bedford, do hereby make known and give this public notice to the Electors of the County of Bedford that a General Election will be held in said County, on the second Tuesday (8th) October, 1861, at the several election districts, viz:

The Electors of the Borough of Bedford and township of Bedford, to meet at the Court House in said Borough.

The Electors of Broad Top township to meet at the School House in the town of Hopewell.

The Electors of Colerain township to meet at the house of Joshua Fuller, in Rainsburg, in said township.

The Electors of Cumberland Valley township to meet at the new School House erected on the land owned by John Whip's heirs in said township.

The Electors of Harrison township to meet at Schoolhouse number 1, near the dwelling house of Henry Keyser in said township.

The Electors of Juniata township to meet at Keyser's School House in said township.

The Electors of Hopewell township to meet at the School House near the house of John Dasher in said township.

State of any city, or of any incorporated district, and also that every member of Congress and of the State Legislature, and of the select or common council of any city or Commissioners of any incorporated district, shall be eligible to be elected or re-elected at the time, the office or appointment of Judge, Inspector or clerk of any election of this Commonwealth, and that no Inspector, Judge or other officer of such election shall be eligible to be elected or re-elected at the time of the election.

And the said act of assembly entitled "An act relating to elections of this Commonwealth," passed July 20, 1861, further provides as follows, to-wit: That the Inspector and Judges shall meet at the respective places appointed for holding the election in the district at which they respectively belong, before 8 o'clock in the morning of the 21st of August of October, and each said Inspector shall appoint one clerk, who shall be a qualified voter of such district.

And the said person who shall have received the second highest number of votes for Inspector shall not attend on the day of any election, then the person who shall have received the second highest number of votes for Judge at the next preceding election shall act as Inspector in his place. And in case the person who has received the highest number of votes for Inspector shall not attend, the person elected Judge shall appoint an Inspector in his place, and in case the person elected Judge shall not attend, then the Inspector, who received the highest number of votes, shall appoint a Judge in his place, and if any vacancy shall continue in the board for the space of one hour after the time fixed by law for the opening of the election, the qualified voters for the township, ward or district at which such officers shall have been elected, present at the election shall select one of their number to fill such vacancy.
