Breeding Animals must be well fed. A quart or two of oil meal daily, or an equivalent of rye bran mixed, is good. If roots are plenty, cut up and feed four to eight quarts a day with the meal ; if not, save them until just before calving, and after that, to be used until grass comes, or the rye for soiling is fit

Mares should be treated in very much the same way ; a few carrots are an excellent addition to the diet, and roots and oil cake may be fed freely if care be taken that they do not induce an old sun-bonnet over my curls, or a too great laxness of the bowels; constipation is to be always guarded against in animals approaching partuition.
