Second-No agent of any publishing house to be permitted to do any work in the county, be he either general or local agent, beyond send-ing his books and terms as above stated. Any house or agent violating this understanding their books to be coented out of the contest.

Third-The several school boards of the county after examination of at which each director shall make fers to have adopted in the county and to send it to Henry Meyer, Esq., County Supe intendent, Rebersburg, Pa., prior to the first day of June, or preferences shall be the series recommended for county uniformity. send the result of the same to each of the papers in the county for pub-
