Our Washington letter.

Washington, D. C. Feb. 28th, 1880. So far as Presidential Candidates are concerned, there was never a better prospect of harmony for the Democratic Convention than now, nor a better prospect for a quarrel in any convention than in the coming Republican convention.

Besides this unprecedented rivalry among leaders, the radical party has on its hands a question which in no previous election has assumed so much importance. I am told that educated and aspiring negroes—Senator Edmunds might call them "niggers"—are dissatisfied with the measure proposed given them by the Republican party and are angry, because of their social position when they happen to have seats in the Senate or to occupy other official positions.
