THE GRAVEYARD FRAUDS. Proceedings to Wind them Up Inaugurated by the Attorney General.

HARRISBURG, April 13. Insurance Commissioner Forster, who has been collecting data for months, with a view of exterminating the graveyard insurance nuisance, recently directed the attention of the Attorney General to the fact that two hundred and thirteen companies of this description had made themselves liable to dissolution by failure to comply with the insurance laws of the State.

COMPANIES TO SHOW CAUSE WHY THEIR CHARTERS SHOULD NOT BE REVOKED AND WHY THEY SHOULD NOT BE PREVENTED FROM DOING FURTHER BUSINESS IN THE STATE. One hundred and thirty-seven of the associations have been proceeded against because they have issued policies for indefinite and contingent amounts, approved and recognized assignments of policies to persons having no insurance interest in the lives of the parties in whose names the policies were issued and that they are insolvent. The revocation of the charters of seventy-six companies is sought because they have failed to exhibit an annual statement of its capital stock, guaranteed capital or accumulated reserve in lieu of capital stock, and of all assets, assessments and liabilities, and to answer interrogatories of the Insurance Commissioner as to their true character and condition.

THE RULE APPLIED FOR BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL IS RETURNABLE MAY 11. The companies indicated embrace all in the State that have been placing insurance on the lives of old and decrepit people and paying only a portion of the risk.

A STRANGE FAMILY BEWAOEMENT. CRESSONA, Pa., April 10.—Until a week ago the family of Matthias Burkert, of this place, contained four boys, aged respectively nine, seven, five and two years. Last Monday the eldest complained of ill health and died on Wednesday. While the parents were attending the funeral on Good Friday the third in age died and the second in age was taken sick. He also died on Saturday. A few hours later the youngest was stricken down and died yesterday afternoon, thus making three corpses in the family at the same time and the fourth death in five days.
