#### Subornation of Perjury.

WILLIAMSPORT, May 6 .- Late last night McKenney Smith, ex-County Commissioner, was arrested for subornation of perjury growing out of his trial and acquittal for forgery before the Criminal Court this week, and held for trial. The information was made by A. J. Webster, one of counsel engaged in prosecuting him for forgery. His arrest was hastened last night by a suspicion that he was preparing to skip the county to av oid further prosecution for peculations while in office. To-day the Board of County Commis sioners employed Samuel L. Lina, P. R. Allen and Addison Candor to conduct the proposed suit against the members of the old board on the charge of robbing the county. Their arrest will soon follow and their alleged crooked conduct will undergo a rigid judicial investigation.

#### URIAH MOYER TO HANG. Supreme Court Refuses Appeal for New Trial.

SELINSGROEE, May 5.—The case of the commonwealth against Uriah Moyer, one of the convicted and sentenced Kintzler murd erers, came up in the supreme court and it was non prossed. The defendant wanted the case continued, but the co urt refused the application. It is not k nown whether there will be an effort to secure the intervention of the board of pardons. Uriah Mover is the member of the mountain gang who fled to Michigan soon after the murder, and remained there, as he suppposed, in safe concealment for some time. #### TERRIBLE CRIME

LORD CAVENDISH AND HIS UNDER SECRETARY ASSASIN-ATED.

The man murdered whom Forster had selected to carry out his peace policy in Ireland.

Advices from Dublin under date of May 6th state that Sccretary Lord Cavendish, and Under Secretary Burke, were cruelly assassinated in 100 Phenix Park, Dublin, at about 7 o'clock of that day. They were both strolling in the park about half a mile from the city gate and a quarter of a mile from the chief secretary's lodge when a car drove up containing four men, two of whom jumped down from the car and attacked Lord Frederick Cavendish and Mr. Burke, stabbing them both several times in the throat 34 of 196 and breast. The victims struggled hard for life and in the struggle became separated, their bodies being found about ten paces apart. The 433 tragedy occurred about ten minutes after 7 o'clock in the evening and in broad daylight. The bodies were first discovered by two young gentlemen who were riding bicycles through the 433 park, and who immediately gave the alarm to the police. Surgeons soon reached the spot, but the police were already conveying Mr. Burke's body away to town, where an examination showed life to be extinct. The upper part of the body was perforated in a shocking manner and presented a ghastly sight. Proceeding further the medical men reached the body of Lord Frederick Cavendish, which was being conveyed away from the park on a stretcher. The body of the cief secretary displayed the same dreadful wounds, in addition to which his left arm was also broken and torn as if he had put it up to protect his breast. Lord Frederick Cavendish was quite dead. The bodies were taken 433 to Steven's hospital, where they will 433 remain until an inquest is held. The locality of the outrage is terribly mark- 481 ed with blood. The spot where the body of Lord Frederick Cavendish was Alexander's block on the second Saturday of each mouth at 1%, P.
