TERRIBLE CRIME

LORD CAVENTISH AND HIS UNDER SECRETARY ASSASSINATED.

The man murdered whom Forster had selected to carry out his peace policy in Ireland.

Advices from Dublin under date of May 6th state that Secretary Lord Cavendish, and Under Secretary Burke, were cruelly assassinated in Phoenix Park, Dublin, at about 7 o'clock of that day.

They were both strolling in the park about half a mile from the city gate and a quarter of a mile from the chief secretary's lodge when a car drove up containing four men, two of whom jumped down from the car and attacked Lord Frederick Cavendish and Mr. Burke, stabbing them both several times in the throat and breast.

The victims struggled hard for life and in the struggle became separated, their bodies being found about ten paces apart. The tragedy occurred about ten minutes after 7 o'clock in the evening and in broad daylight. The bodies were first discovered by two young gentlemen who were riding bicycles through the park, and who immediately gave the alarm to the police.

Surgeons soon reached the spot, but the police were already conveying Mr. Burke's body away to town, where an examination showed life to be extinct. The upper part of the body was perforated in a shocking manner and presented a ghastly sight.

Proceeding further the medical men reached the body of Lord Frederick Cavendish, which was being conveyed away from the park on a stretcher. The body of the chief secretary displayed the same dreadful wounds, in addition to which his left arm was also broken and torn as if he had put it up to protect his breast.

Lord Frederick Cavendish was quite dead. The bodies were taken to Steven's hospital, where they will remain until an inquest is held. The locality of the outrage is terribly marked with blood. The spot where the body of Lord Frederick Cavendish was found was absolutely deluged, while Mr. Burke's body lay in a pool of blood.

It is said that after the act the murderers immediately drove off. There seems to be no clue to the assassins at present, but the police are taking most extraordinary measures to discover the perpetrators. A large quantity of notes and gold coin besides their gold watches were found in the pockets of the victims which showed that the object of the crime was not robbery.

Great excitement prevails throughout Dublin and wide-spread indignation is expressed over the event.

No motive is known for the dreadful deed, and no clue to the dastardly assassins is yet apparent.

A CONDUCTOR'S CONDUCT. It Costs a Railroad Company Three Thousand Dollars.

NEW YORK, May 5.—Wm. Peas to-day obtained a judgment for \$3,000 against the Delaware and Lackawanna railroad company for forcible ejection from a train because he offered the conductor the wrong part of an excursion ticket, the other part having been taken up by mistake by another conductor.

The contract for the grading and masonry of the Shamokin, Sunbury & Lewisburg rail road has been awarded to Thomas Reilly, of Pottsville and William Nolan of Reading. The work will require about a year, and is estimated to cost over a million dollars.

The beautiful and massive court house of Allegheny county was totally destroyed by fire last Sunday. The loss is \$200,000, with only \$50,000 insured. One life was also lost.
