HOW THEY LIKE THE TICKET.

What They Will Do.

HON. C. S. WOLFE HEARD FROM.

PHILADELPHIA, May 12.—FR. E. Danbar Lockwood, one of the independent leaders, received the following dispatch from Hon. Charles S. Wolfe to-day.

"LEWISBURG, Pa., 9:20 A. M., May 12, 1882.—Mr. E. Danbar Lockwood: Please have announced in papers that I never sought, bargained for, nor consented to accept any place on the republican state ticket. I simply did not decline a place in advance of its being offered to me. My enemies have exhausted their efforts. Some of my friends have shown their folly. I have not betrayed, nor contemplated the betrayal of the cause for which I have made some sacrifices. I have been tried and condemned on misrepresentations and suspicious.

At this time we need united councils and harmonious action. I shall waste no effort in vindictive myself. God is my witness in my words, my acts and my motives.

CHAS. L. S. WOLFE."

One of Mr. Wolfe's closest friends is Hon. G. E. Maps, of Venango county.

That gentleman said to-day: "I am Mr. Wolfe's friend and have been intimately associated with him from the beginning of this movement. I advised him to accept no place on the ticket, whatever should be offered to him. I have no idea that Cameron ever intended to give him anything. It was the easiest thing in the world for him to offer Wolfe a place and then pass the word around to the boys to kick. The independents to-day are stronger than ever. A number of important accessions to the ranks have been made very recently. Senator Stewart, of Franklin, has come out on our side, and so has Thomas W. Phillips, of Lawrence, and a number of others."

SENATOR MITCHELL SPEAKS.

WASHINGTON, May 10th.—Senator Mitchell spoke with much freedom this evening regarding the nominations. He was interviewed by a Patriot correspondent as to the action of the Independents and delivered himself as follows:

"Senator," said the correspondent, "what course will the independents pursue with respect to the ticket I have just shown you?"

"We will have nothing to do with it whatever—we shall hold our convention as previously decided upon and nominate our own people with the possible exception of Rawle. It is barely possible that we may endorse him but certainly none of the others."

"Will not one result of this matter be the smothering and political death of Wolfe?"

"No, sir. You will see before many days that in all his communications with the stalwarts Wolfe has insisted in the event of his nomination as lieutenant governor that the entire ticket should be wholly exceptable to the independents or he would have none of it. He has neither courted the Camerons nor has he been guilty of the slightest duplicity. He has acted the part of an honorable man and a clever politician throughout."

"Will Wolfe receive a place on your ticket?" "He will if he wants it. To be frank with you, I do not believe he wants anything."

"What will be Wolfe's course in the future?" "He will be the leader of the Independents as he always has been. When our ticket shall be nominated Wolfe will take the stump and do yeoman service for our cause."

"Whom shall you nominate at your convention on the 24th instant?" "That is to a certain extent problematical, I think I may safely say, however, that Philip C. Garret, of Philadelphia, will be our nominee for governor."

The other independent leaders are in entire harmony with Wolfe and M. Bell. The stalwart ticket will have little if any support from Independents.

THE REPUBLICAN STATE CONVENTION.

Cameron's Power Supreme.

THE TICKET SELECTED BY THE BOSESSES.

Goes Through.

The Republican State Convention met at Harrisburg on Wednesday the 10th instant. A full delegation from every part of the state as well as a large number of politicians, expectants and camp followers from all sections, were present. At 11:23 Chairman Cooper called the convention to order. W. S. Kilpatrick, of Northampton county was chosen chairman pro tem, made a speech in which he lauded the deeds of the Republican party to the very skies. The organization was completed by appointing two secretaries. A committee on permanent organization named Hon. George Lear for permanent chairman. He also made a speech glorifying the party to his utmost pitch. Some minor business was then attended to, after which the real work of the convention began. This consisted of nothing more nor less than to ratify the ticket which Cameron, Quay & Co. had already selected several months ago. This was done in best regular style. The machine was never in better order and worked like a charm, until it came to the office of Congressman-at-large. State Treasurer Butler was the slated candidate of the bosses, but by some strange, unaccountable freak the convention refused to endorse Butler and a side movement was made for Tom Marshall, who after some skirmishing was nominated with a rush and a yell. This was the only kick the machine made. All else was harmonious and lovely. Mr. Beaver's speech as well as the platform read very smoothly and nicely. Reform is promised very profusely for next year. It is only for this one year yet that the bosses ask to have their own way.

The Independents are entirely left out in the cold. Just what they will do about it does not yet appear very clearly.

The following is the ticket set up by the convention, at the command of Don Cameron. Every man of them, except Mr. Rawle and Mr. Marshall, who have pretty broad streaks of Independence, is Don's property, stamped and branded, "D. C." Whether the ticket thus foisted on the Republican party will be elected time alone will tell.

For Governor—James A. Beaver; Lieutenant Governor—W. F. Davis; Supreme Judge—Wm. H. Rawle; Secretary of Internal Affairs—J. M. Greer; Congressman-at-Large—Thomas M. Marshall.

LYCOMING OFFICIALS ARRESTED.

The Old Board of Commissioners Held to Bail on Criminal Charges.

WILLIAMSPORT, May 9. The long-looked-for arrest of the old Board of County Commissioners—Daniel Corson, McKinney Smith and William C. Ebner—as a commencement of criminal proceedings against them in court, was made to-day. The information was made by the present Board of Commissioners, Kenneth B. Tomb, Matthias Kaupp and George W. Smith, and contains four separate counts, charging each one with embezzlement, con spiracy, perjury and in being concerned in public contracts. They were taken before Alderman Blair and, having waived a hearing, each one was placed under \$800 bail for court. District Attorney Reardon and A. Addison Candor represented the county and H. C. McCormick appeared for the defendants. Joseph M. Neece went on the bond of Corson, D. H. Foreman on that of McKinney Smith and Nathan B. Kimble and John W. Buck on William C. Ebner's. Each of the old Commissioners are still under \$6,000 bonds, which were filed by them when they first went into office. The trial, which will come off before the October Court, will be an interesting one, as it is expected that some very crooked things will be developed.
