The Legislature in Extra Session.

For some time past it was plainly manifest that no apportionment bills would pass the regular session of the legislature. The Stewart majority of the Senate defeated all attempts of the Democrats and Independents combined to formulate and pass equitable legislative, congressional and judicial apportionments, and Gov Pattison has therefore called an extra session in order to do the work that could and should have been done by the regular session.

The Governor's reason for calling the extra session are sound and logical and he will be fully sustained by fair-minded people of all parties. He says in his call among other things: "The constitution commands the general assembly to apportion the state into senatorial and representative districts, the imperative mandate has not been obeyed. By the joint action of your house the time has come when any bills discharging a purpose to perform this duty can be presented to me for approval."

The obligation is imposed upon the governor to "take care that the laws be faithfully executed." I deem it my duty, therefore, to exhaust my lawful authority to correct the grave default of the legislature.

Equally important and necessary, though not so specifically commanded by law, is the duty of the assembly to apportion the state into congressional and judicial districts. I, therefore, designate the apportionment of the state into senatorial, representative, congressional and judicial districts, as subjects for legislative consideration.

A GOOD GOVERNOR.

Chairman Honable's Tribute to Governor Pattison.

During the long session which has just ended he has discharged the duties of his gubernatorial office with zeal, intelligence and good judgment. He has carefully scrutinized the acts of the legislature, and has withheld his approval from a good number of them. In every instance his veto has been sustained by the legislature, and approved by the people.

Stopping a Campaign Fraud.

June 1st, 1883, \$2,790,041.39 of state money was credited to various banks in this state. The interest on this sum, varied according to the needs of the treasury, has formed in times past the republican campaign assessment fund. The house placed a prohibition on this payment by the state of republican campaign expense by passing the bill amending the provisions of section three of an act approved February 12, 1876, an act supplementary to the several acts relating to the state treasurer and commissioners of the sinking fund. The bill passed by an almost strictly partisan vote.
