HORATIO SEYMOUR DEAD. CLOSE OF A LONG, HONORED EVENTFUL CAREER.

A Politician from His Youth, Twice Governor of New York and Once Democratic Candidate for the Presidency.

UTICA, N. Y., Feb. 12.—Ex-Governor Seymour died at exactly 10 o'clock to-night at the residence of his sister, Mrs. Roscoe Conkling. He began to fail perceptibly at 4 o'clock this afternoon.

At half-past 8 he was sinking rapidly, his pulse could scarcely be counted and the respiration was more difficult. He expired without a struggle and as peacefully as if falling asleep.

Mourning For Seymour.

UTICA, Feb. 13.—The funeral of Ex-Governor Seymour will take place from Trinity Church, Utica, at 2 P. M. on Tuesday, February 16.

"I wish the grief of the people, who mourn a citizen of national fame and a Christian gentleman of the purest example, might lighten the sad bereavement and assuage the sacred sorrow of his stricken wife."

"I learn this morning the sorrowful intelligence that the mortal career of your illustrious brother is closed. Convey to his relatives, and when a suitable occasion arrives to Mrs. Seymour, my warm sympathies at their loss.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18.—The New York delegation held a meeting in the House ways and means committee room to-day immediately after the adjournment of the House and passed resolutions expressing sorrow at the death of Ex-Governor Seymour and eulogizing his great public services and private worth.
