### AN AUSTRIAN TOWN SWEPT 368 BY FIRE.

A Hundred People Killed in One Street and Hundreds of Others Missing.

VIENNA, April 18 .- The town of Stry, in Galicia, has been almost completely destroyed by fire. The number of houses burned is about six hundred. The inhabitants are destitute.

A high wind was blowing and the fire started in several parts of the town at about the same time. Many inhabi tants were killed by falling walls and steeples. One hundred persons were killed in one street. The Town Hall, railway station and the telegraph office ed from office, and General Wagner is were destroyed.
