One person for Governor. Two persons for Coroners. One person for County Commissioner. The Freemen of the County of Philadelphia, to elect Six Representatives for said County in General Assembly.

One Representative for said County in the House of Representatives of the United States. The Freemen of the County of Philadelphia, and County of Delaware, to elect One Senator for the State.

THE Collectors of each Ward, District, &c. are to hold their election, in the different districts to choose their inspectors for the ensuing year, and to give their attendance at the time and respective places.

For and upon every Coach, 15 dols. upon every Chariot, 12 dols. upon every Post Chariot, 12 dols. upon every Post Chaise, 12 dols. upon every Phaeton, with or without top, 9 dols. upon every Coach, 9 dols. upon other Carriages, having panel work above, with blinds, glaces or curtains, 9 dols. upon four wheel carriages, having framed polls and tops with steel springs, 6 dols. upon four wheel top Carriages, with wooden or iron springs or jacks, 3 dols. upon curries with tops, 3 dols. upon chaises with tops, 3 dols. upon chairs with tops, 3 dols. upon hulks with tops, 3 dols. upon other two wheel top carriages, 3 dols. upon two wheel carriages, with steel or iron springs, 3 dols.
