The drawing-room, the two parlours below, and the entry, are papered up to the third story: In the room over the kitchen is an open stove. In the wash room there is an oven, and the back buildings, from the cellar, all the way up, have large closets, and in the cellar is a large bottle rack, a wine store is taken off of the cellar, and three bins to hold bottled liquor are made in said rooms with padlocks to them; the whole cellar and the cockpit are as well plastered as any room in the house.
