It is to be un-derflood, that the Contractor is to be at the ex-ence and tike of iffuing the famplies to the troops at each poft, and that all loffes inflained by the depredations of an enemy, or by means of the troops of the United States, fhall be paid for at the price of the articles captured or deflroyed, on the depositions of two or more perfons of creditable cha-racters, and the cortificate of a commifiend officer, af-certaining the circumfances of the lofs, and the amount certaining the circumflances of the lofs, and the amo of the articles for which compensation shall be claimed
