Sales of Depreciation Land, TO THE PUBLIC, WHEREAS a number of tracts of land commonly called Depreciation Land, formerly in Westmerland, now in Allegheny county, were sold at Greensburg, in the month of August last, by the commissioners of Westmerland, for taxes pretended to be due for Allegheny county, in the year 1789; and whereas the said taxes were not legally assessed, nor the said commissioners authorized to sell, nor due notice of the intended sale given, the commissioners for a pre-cluded tax not exceeding in the whole 231 dollars, having sold 58 3/4 acres of valuable land.
