OR carrying into effect the fixth article of the reaty of amity, commerce and navigation, con luded between his Britannic majefty and the United tates of America, on the 19th day of November 794, having this day conflitted their Board aurfuant and agreeably to the faid treaty, do here by give notice, that they are ready to proceed to afinefs accordingly; and they defire that all claim inder the faid article (which fo far as the fame decribes the cafes thereby provided for, is hereuntainnexed) may be lodged with their Secretary with out delay.

Extract from the faid article,

"Whereas it is alledged by divers British merical chants, and others his majesty's subjects, that debts to a considerable amount, which were bona fide contracted, before the peace, still remain owing to them by citizens or inhabitants of the United States; and that by the operation of various lawful impediments, since the peace, not only the full recovery of the said debts has been delayed, but also the value and security thereof have been in several instances impaired and selfened, so that by the ordinary course of judicial proceedings, the British creditors cannot now obtain and actually have and receive full and adequate compensation for the losses and damages which they have thereby suffained: It is agreed that in all such cases where sull compensation for such losses and damages cannot for whatgreed that in all fuch cases where full compensions too fuch losses and damages cannot for whe ever reason be actually obtained, had and recover the too for the faid creditors in the ordinary count of justice, the United States will make full a complete compensation for the fame to the fact creditors: but it is distinctly understood, the this provision is to extend to fuch losses only have been occasioned by the lawful impediment aforefaid, and is not to extend to losses occasioned by such insolvency of the debtors or oth causes, as would equally have operated to produce such loss, if the said impediments had not existed; nor to such losses or damages as has been occasioned by the manifest delay, or neg sence, or wilful omission of the claimant."

The general agent thinks it his duty further to suggest that the several claims ought to be accompanied and supported by the affidavits of the claimants duly sworn and regularly attested, both as to the existence of the debts claimed, and such other circumstances as may be within their own knowledge respectively. And wherever the claimants in staining the nature of their evidence (which must in every instance be the best of which the case is capable) have occasion to refer to the testimony of wincestes, it will be proper to apprife the general agent of the names and places of residence of such wincestes and the facts to be established by their testimony.
