THE Letters to Dr. Currie, which I published haft autumn, led me to an inveftigation of the origin and phenomena of peftilential difeafes in other countries, as well as in the United St tes. In the profecution of the fubject, new facts and principles continually opened to my view, and fi-nally determined me to trace back the hiftory of fuch difeafes as far as the records of hiftory ex-tend. For this purpofe, I have examined the pub-lic libraries in New-York, New-Havea, Cam-bridge and Bofton, with a view to obtain all the material facts which can'illuftrate the fubject, and I have nearly collected all the materials for the propofed work. propofed work. The facts collected will enable me to demon-The facts collected will enable me to demon-farate that many of the common ideas refpecting pedilential epidemics, are unlounded or extreme-ly incorrect; and this in confequence of medical writers confidering an epidemic difeafe as a detach-ed or ifolated phenomenon in a particular 'coun-try; rather than as connected with other epide-mics or other phenomenon of particular prime march 30. ary; rather than as connected with other epide-nsics or other phenomena of nature in various parts of the world. The facts I have collected lead to certain deductions which are furprising to myfelf, and which will probably be new to many others. Much hght will be thrown on this dark and perplexing fubject, as well as on natural phi-lofenby.
