That every house keeper within the city of Philadelphia, the townships of the Northern Liberties and Moyamensing, and district of Southwark, within a mile of the limits of the city, taking in boarders arriving by sea or by land, from any foreign port or place, and having any boarder in his or her samily, who shall be taken sick of any disease whatsever, between the first day of May and the first day of November in any year, within twenty days next after such boarder shall come to lodge in his or her house, shall within 24 hours next after the knowledge of such sickness. make report at the Health Office of the name of such fick person, the time of his or her arrival at the house and of his or her being taken fick, and of the name and place of abode of such house keeper; whereupon the Physician of the Health-Office shall forth with visit the patient, and report to the office his opinion of the nature of such disease, that measures may be taken to prevent the spreading of the insection; and if any housekeeper shall neglect to give information in the manner and within the time aforesaid, and shall be thereof convicted, in any court of cr. minal jurisdiction within this Commonwealth, upon indictment by verdict or consession, nor more than one hundred dollars, to be imposed at the discretion of the court, according to the circumstances of greater or less aggravation attending each particular case.
