The following articles were published in a Postfcript to yesterday's Gazette. The intelligence was received at too late an hour to accompany the first thousand of our impreffion. And as many of our Readers, of courfe, have not read it, it is for that reafon inferted to-day, along with further extracts from London papers.

LONDON, October 1. By the Prince of Wales packet, which brought over the mail, difpatches of confiderable impor-tance were received from fir Morton Eden at

tance were received from fir Morton Eden at Vienna. Captain Sutton, the Commander of the packet, came with them himfelf, and arriv-ed this morning at Lord Grenville's office. Thele difpatches, we are informed, contain the pleafing confirmation of admiral Nelfon having taken 15 fail of the line, fome frigates, and 40 transports, and that two fail of the line only had efcaped into the port of Malta. The difpatches were immediately forwarded to Lord Grenville at Dropmore, and copies of them to Mr. Pitt at Holwood. The news will probably be announced officially by a letter to the Lord Mayor—if in time for poft, we shall stop the prefs to infert it.

This day a mail arrived from Hamburg, which brings fome intelligence from Con-flantinople respecting the French fleet.-According to thefe accounts, Admiral Nel-fon found it in the harbor of Alexandria; but the Bay of Begnieres, formerly men-tioned as the place of action, is only a little to the eaftward of Alexandria; and this difagreement in the accounts does not invalidate the truth of an action having taken place. Indeed this is confirmed by the ac-counts from Rhodes, by which it appears that fome of the French frightes which had elcaped from being captured by our fleet, had been feized by the Turks upon encer-ing that harbear in actions of the form ing that harbour, in confequence of orders previoufly received from the Porte, which may now be confidered as having commenced hoftilities against France, or rather as having retaliated on her for the first aggression.

Saturday noon fome Difpatches were re-ceived at the Duke of Portland's Office, at Whi-chall, from the Commandant at Jerfey, brought over to the Isle of Wight by the regular packet. Every thing was quiet at that and the other iflands when this vefiel failed. At St. Maloes and the adjacent fea ports of France, there was a general calm, and no appearance of preparations of any fort.

On Saturday, orders were fent to Portf-mouth by the Telegraph, for the 44th re-giment of toot, quartered at Hilfea barracks to embark immediately on board the Wey mouth armed transport, and hold itself in readiness for foreign service.


