A sufficient sum of the surplus of the duries on Imports and Tonnage beyond the permanent appropriations heretolore charged upon them, by law, together with the faith of the United States are hereby pledged for the fulfillment of this contract, in pursuance of, and according to the terms and consistions of the all of Congress herein before recited.
