A number of citizens would take it as

a favor if the Health Committee in this city would favor the public with an exact flatement, as far as they know, concerning the malignant fever at present said to exist amongst us.

As yet we know but little, only from common report; and often what we have from this source proves upon examination to be erroneous. Many exaggerated reports are circulating in the country, stating matters to be worse than they really are; such reports will have a much worse tendency in deterring country people from coming in with produce, so absolutely necessary to supply our markets, than an impartial statement of facts iffued officially by the board of health, to which, no doubt, credit board of health, to which, no doubt, credit would generally be given, both in city and country. This would have another good effect: If there be danger, then both citizens and country people would be warned of it and conduct themselves accordingly, as they would then be informed of the partic ular spot where danger may be apprehended; and if there be no danger, they ought also to be informed of this. Such a measure would have a tendency to check the influ-RR. ence of falle reports.

Since the 11th instant, four persons have died of a malignant Fever. The first, Mr. Reuben Judd, died on Monday—Mr. Timothy Burr, on Thursday morning—Mr. Samthy Burr, on Thursday morning—Mr. Samuel Horton, on Thursday evening, and Mr. Jerimiah Coock, son of Mr. James Coock, Jerimiah Coock, fon of Mr. James Coock, on Saturday. There are now (Sunday August 18th, 1 o'clock P. M. five persons sick with the same distemper, viz. Mr. William Fly, Mr. Simon Colton, Mr. — Munn, a boatman belonging to Massachusetts, a child of capt. Joseph Day, and a young woman, whose name we do not know. Mr. Colton is considered as the most dangerous; the others there are strong hopes, will recove the others there are strong hopes will recov-er. There have been but two cases since Tuefday last. Several people have felt un-well, but no other instance of the fever has ppened that we have been able to learn. There appears yet no fatisfactory general fource from which the fickness might have been derived. Measures are taking as far as possible to trace out the real facts, in every instance, that some judgment may be formed, whether the sever originated here, or whether it was imported. One remark we will make. The season hitherto has been as healthy as perhaps was even known; and we think so fine a season can scarcely be remembred. Every instance of the sickness, that has taken place, except two, has been either upon Front-street, or between that street, and Connecticut River. Front-street runs from the little river about twenty rods east from Col. Seymour's northward to the upper part of the town, between which, and Connecticut River, lies the low land, which

is flowed in the spring.
