Formerly when a rupture happened, those ministers roak leave ; in these days we find that a directory drives them away, and in the most arbitrary manner.

Sixth Congress of the United States At the First Seffion, begun and held at the City of Philadelphia, in the State of Pennfylvania, on Monday, the fecond of December, one thousand feven hundred and ninety-nine.

#### AN ACT

Extending the privilege of franking to William Henry Harrifon, the delegate from the territory of the United States, north west of the Ohio; and making provision for his compensation.

Sec. 1. B E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America, in, Congress as-sembled, That William Henry Harrifon, the delegate to Congress from the territory of the United States, north weft of the river Ohio, be entitled to the privilege of fending and receiving letters free of poffage, on the fame terms and under the fame reftrictions as are provided for the Members of the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States, by the act, intituled "An Act to effablish the Post office and Post roads within the United States."

Imprefied with lively fentiments of the emi-nent virtues of that diffinguifhed HERO and PATRIOT, the hiffery of whofe life I have undertaken to writs; it was not till after much reflection I refolved on iffuing thefe propolals. — The following confiderations induced me to this; *Eirft*, having obtained in the course of an extensive correspondence; with many geatle-men of talents and information, a large flock of original materials concerning the life of this Illuftrious Citizen; to give form and body to thete, in the manner of hillory, will preferve many important things that otherwife would moff probably be lott. Secondly, as many of the moff interefing tranfactions of his life, fince he refigned his commiffies as Commander in chief of our revolutionary armies, are very im-perfect y recorded, and little underflood; yet the greater part of them being fresh in the me-monies of many, this muß he the fitteft time to embody them; before a fuceffion of objects, which every day brings forth, wears off the manuter circumfances. 
