NEW CONSTITUTION.

Buonaparte affembled at the Confular Palase, on the 8th of December, the two Legi-flative Commiffions. Roger Ducos took the chair.

Dannou read the plan of the New Consti-tution, of which we have only bitherto

collected imperfect fragments. The difcuffion was calm, and every way worthy of fo great a caufe. They first difcuffed it in whole and then article by article. Some of the articles were frongly combated, but they were carried by a great majo-rity : others were rejected, and it was here that Buonaparte manifelted his wonderful powers, for, after having collected all the opinions for and against an article, he com-mented on the argument advanced, and concluded by bringing the majority to agree to the propolitions which he made.

The affembly did not feparate till feven o'clock next morning; and the effimable Daunon was appointed to digeft the altera-tions which were made; and the act will be made public in a few days. Citizen Ræderer has now lifted up fano-

LONDON, December 15.

Notwithstanding the suffernion of arms concluded between Gen. 
