I Have a poculiar satisfaction in commu nicating to you, for the information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that his Majesty's late ship Hermione is a-gain restored to his navy, by as daring and gallant an enterprize as is to be found in our naval annals, under the command of capt. Hamilton himself, with the beats of the

Captain Hamilton's own letter, with the reports accompanying it (copies of which are enclosed.) will sufficiently explain to their Lordships the detail of this service, and the bravery with which the attack was fupported, and leaves me only one observato make on the very gallant action, which adds infin te honour to captain Hamilton as an officer, for his conception of the fervice he was about to undertake -This was, Sir, his disposition for the attack; which was that a number of chosen men, to the amount of fifty, with himself, should board and the remainder in the boats from this ma couvre he had formed the idea, that while he was diffusting for the possession of the ship, she was approaching the Surprise, who was laying elose into the harbour, and in ease of being beat out of the Hermione, he would have an opportunity of taking up the contest upon more favourable terms.

To the steady execution of these orders was owing the success of this bold and daring undertaking, which mustever have rank among the foremost of the many gallant ac-tions executed by our navy this war.

I find the Hermione has had a thorough

repair, and is in complete order; I have therefore ordered her to be furveyed and valued, and shall commission her as soon as the reports are made to me from the offi-

Surprize, Port Royal Harbour, Nov. 1. 1799.

The honour of my country and the glory of the British navy were throng inducements for me to make an attempt to cut out, by the boats of his majefly's ship under my com-mand, his Majefly's late ship Hermione, from the harbour of Porto Cavallo, where there are about 200 pieces of cannon mounted on the batteries.

Every Officer and man on this Expedition behaved with an uncommon degree of valour and exertion; but I confider it particularly my duty to mention the very gallant conduct, as well as the aid and affifta at a particular crifis, I received from Mr. John M'Mullen, Surgeon and Volunteer, and Mr. Maxwell, Gunner, even after the

latter was dangerously wounded.

As the Frigate was the particular object. of your order of the 17th September, I have thought proper to return into Port with her. Enclosed I transmit you a list of captures during the Cruize, also two lists of killed and wounded.
