HISTORIC LESSON.

Just a century ago, a hostile fleet appeared in Chesapeake Bay, and landed on the Patuxent a couple of brigades, which made a vigorous push on the Federal metropolis. They were confronted at Bladensburg by a hastily collected Union force, mainly composed of Maryland militia, which ought to have arrested their progress, but served rather to accelerate it. The British speedily chased the shattered remains into Washington, which they soon left behind in a wild race for life. The British pursued no farther, but, turning the public edifices and stores, with the establishment of the government, returned to their ships as hardily as they came. They next made an attempt on Baltimore, and were repulsed and their commander slain. They then took themselves off, and made no further serious demonstration in that quarter.

GENERAL RICKETTS'S ENGAGEMENT.

General Ricketts's Engagement. The Battle of General Wallace, Baltimore, Md., July 11. When General Wallace fell back from Frederick to this side of Monocacy bridge, on the 12th of July, he was followed by the Rebels, who were attacking the bridge being the left, towards Williams, and the 11th Maryland, one hundred men, the extreme right on the Baltimore turnpike.

THE ATTACK UPON GENERAL RICKETTS.

Towards noon on the 10th the Rebels, with about eight hundred infantry, came down from the direction of Frederick, and attacked our front and left centres, held by General Ricketts's veterans. Previous to this Colonel Gendron had ordered Major Wade with three companies of the 3rd Illinois Cavalry down to the extreme right to burn some bridges and burn the stock on the country already there. Before reaching his destination, however, the Major received a message from the Colonel, advising him to return at once if possible, as a force of the enemy had already started in force.
