Atlanta.

The full confirmation not only of the fall of Atlanta, but of the decisive defeat of a portion of the enemy's force, is supplied by the official dispatch of General Sherman, published in the Union. It was again a decisive victory, which decided the fate of the rebel stronghold. General Sherman abandoned the greater part of his line east and north of Atlanta, holding only the Chattahoochee and its approaches with the 20th Corps, and with the rest of his army retreated limit with the Atlanta railroad toward its junction with the Georgia coast.

A Rebel force of 20,000 men, 22 miles south of Atlanta on the Macon road, was by the advance of Sherman's army, and the 20th Corps, driven back to the Chattahoochee, and then to the city, and finally, after a hard fight, was annihilated and defeated on the 1st of September, with the loss of ten guns, 15,000 prisoners, and at least 20,000 killed.

Upon becoming aware of Sherman's movement, and of the division of his army, and the occupation of his only line of communication, it fled and blew up his magazines in Atlanta, destroyed the rolling stock of the railway, and fled in the night.

This is the victory of General Sherman, more brilliant, and more disastrous to the enemy, than previous successes had led us to anticipate. It is the same triumphant march, which has led to his last victory, and sees a detachment of his army well destroyed by a sudden and unexpected attack. The rebel army, which has fallen upon him, he both parts his army to give battle, and completely annihilated the remainder, and the security of which has rendered the rebel army, and the security of his forces which invited the effort of General Sherman.

Though he may have escaped with a considerable fragment of troops, it is evident the campaign and the State are lost to him. As we saw in the case of the capture of the city, the importance of complete military possession of the central pillar of the Rebel Confederacy, and the need to respect, not will Sherman permit, that the fruits of this conquest be allowed to be gathered.
