At City Point, and in fact all along our whole line, perfect quiet prevailed yesterday morning, and there were no indications of anything decisive being near at hand.

General Butler's engagement on Friday the relative losses are stated as General Grant's headquarters have been—Union, two hundred and sixty, and of the Rebels, one thousand.
