WINE IN FRANCE.

Paris, November 11.—A friend who has lately returned from the vine districts about Bordeaux describes the vintage as magnificent—wines abundant and of excellent quality, and we are promised a great fall in the price of all articles of primary necessity in this country. Proprietors of wine say the diminution in the price will cause a great many failures among those engaged in the wine trade. Fine wines, as well as inferior ones, are extraordinary abundant. The very finest made in France, the Sauterne, is made from the vineyards of a very few proprietors. That called the Chateau Yquem is owned by one person, the Marquis de Sauterne, and the vintage of 1863 he will not sell for less than \$1000 the ton. He makes from 150 to 180 tons, and his small territory yields him the pretty income of \$20,000 to \$30,000.
