THE SOCIAL UNION.—An adjourned meet-ing of the Social Union was held last evening in the lecture room of the Second Reformed Dutch Church, Seventh street, above Brown. Mr. D. W. C. Moore, President of the Union, occupied the chair. The meeting was opened by the sing-ing of a hymn, atter which J. Y. Mitchell, of the Central N. L. Presbyterian Church, offered prayer. Addresses were delivered by Mr. Ward, Rev. Mr. Lowensbury, and Dr. Osler. The nomination of a board of managers was then referred to a committee of taree. The com-mittee reported a list of names, and a board of managers was elected, consisting of fifty persons – twenty-five of each sex—the clergymen of the - twenty-five of each sex—the clergymen of the various Evangelical churches of the city to be ex-officio members of the board. Dr. Osler reported resolutions looking to the erection of a hall for the uses of the society, and the obtaining of funds for that purpose, which were adopted. A hymn was then song, and the meet-ing closed with the ben-diction.

FENNSYLVANIA MILITARY LEGION.-A number of returned officers and privates, who served in the late war, have formed themselves into an organization similar to the Scott Legion of this city. The organization was projected by General John F. Ballier, late Colonel of the 98th Pennsylvania Volunteers, and the move-98th Pennsylvania Volunteers, and the move-ment received the support of the following regi-ments:-27th, 73d, 75th, and 18th Pennsylvania Infantry, the 5th and 12th Pennsylvania Cavalry, and the 29th New York infantry. Mem-bers of nearly all the regiments recruited in Pennsylvania have joined the organization, which will be know as the Pennsylvania Mili-tary Legion. Regular meetings are held on the first Thursday in every month.
