Great Fire in Danville-Desruction of the Woollen Factory and many other Buildings-Loss \$150,000.

DANVILLE, Va., March 27.—About 11 o'clock last night the Planing Mill of Messrs, Linn & Co., on the east side of the canal, was discovered to be on fire. The flames communicated to the Danville Woollen Factory adjoining, thence they spread rapidly to the stores of Messrs. Brown & Jeter, Pairo & Co., Yates, William Robinson, Hickson & Brother, and several small buildings on Main street, all of which were totally con-sumed. Total amount of insurance estimated to be from \$60,000 to \$75,000. The Woellen Factory was insured for thirty thousand dollars. The total loss by the fire will foot up one hundred and fitty thousand dollars, much of which is covered by insurance.-Richmond Times.
