FOREIGN.
PRIN. CHINA.—A heathen play has been purchased, to be removed, and a missionary hospital commenced.

GERMANY.—In the Upper Austrian Diet an earnest discussion took place on the claims of Dr. Reutinger, Bishop of Linz, that all children born in the living hospital must be christened by Roman Catholic priests.

COLORED AGAIN.—Dr. Colenso has expressed his willingness to be tried by the Archbishop of Canterbury, but will meanwhile maintain his legal rights as a Colonial Bishop, and claim his salary.

DOMESTIC.
ROMAN CATHOLIC.—The Second National Council of the Roman Catholic Bishops of the United States will be opened in Baltimore on the first Sunday of October.
